- 3+ years SEN Experience, with a strong understanding of PANDAS, Autism & ADHD
- Experience supporting a child with PDA is essential
- Experience caring for babies and toddlers
- A firm but fair approach to boundaries, with a fun and positive energy
- Emotionally Resilient
- Confident in implementing new supportive strategies into the family with warmth and care
- Experience in caring for multiple children
- Strong organisational skills

About the role/family: **SENNIES** is excited to support a loving family of 6 to find a rota Sennie for their son, B6 (PANDAS, ADHD and PDA), B3 and B9 months. They also have a son, B13, who does not require any care from the Sennie. The Sennie would primarily care for B6, B3 and B9 months, but mum is often around, and other household staff including the family PA are always present.

The family are looking for a Sennies to work collaboratively with their current Nanny and with the families PA during handovers at the beginning and end of each shift, to ensure the children's care is continuous. B6 and B3 are at school between the hours of 8am – 4pm during the day, so the Sennie would support mum with care for B9 months, by taking him to baby groups and organising suitable activities. The household is fully staffed, and all staff support each other, so no household chores are expected of the Sennie.

About the child/children: **B6** is a lovely young boy, who enjoys rock climbing and prefers individual sports and activities rather than team games.

B6 is awaiting a diagnosis of PANDAS, ADHD & Autism (with a PDA profile). He experiences anxiety relating to change, transitions and boundaries, and the Sennie would help him to navigate these challenges with a warm and caring approach. B6 also needs support in developing his relationship with his younger brother as there are some sibling rivalry challenges.

As B6 is an August baby, he is currently repeating Year 1 due to his young age. He receives weekly Occupational Therapy for his fine motor skills and has received reading and maths support in the previous year. B6 also has a play therapist. The Sennie will be required to support his therapeutic input by implementing strategies into educational and engaging activities for B6 in the home.

Sensory and safety checklist: *The family have identified that B6 :*

- Resists changes to familiar routines
- Touches the walls of rooms
- Remembers routes and places extremely well
- Covers ears when hears certain sounds
- Finds fine motor movements hard
- Finds it hard to ride a bike
- Has extremely good balance

- Quite clumsy and bumps into objects and people

B3 is a kind and curious little boy who loves puzzles, lego and animals. B3 enjoys team games, activities and puzzles. The Sennie will be able to support the development of his relationship with his brother B6 and also engage with him in his favourite activities.

B9 months is a sweet baby who is enjoying his discovery of the world and his environment. He is becoming more mobile and active and it won't be long before he will be trying to take his first steps!

Both B3 and B9 months are neurotypical.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- Support B6 with his anxiety and help him navigate challenges with change, transitions, and boundaries
- Support mum during the daytime with care for B9 months, going to baby groups and activities
- Prepare snacks and simple meals for B6 and B3 - the family has a cook so no meal preparation required
- Morning preparation and school pick up
- Creating visual aids: timetables etc.
- Assisting with bath time and bedtime routines
- Planning and organising suitable activities for term time and holidays
- Offering behavioural support and managing behaviour
- Organising children's belongings and maintaining their areas
- Implementing strategies and preferred activities, supporting therapy
- Encouraging children's independence and life skills development
- Bring forward any key areas for development
- Organising appointments for the children and keeping the children's calendars organised/up to date

- Someone with prior experience caring for a baby
- Someone with experience caring for multiple children
